

Reopening Schools Safely



Safely Returning to School:

The health and safety of our students, families, and staff is our first priority. When students return to school this year, it will look very different from what they are used to seeing. New health and safety measures will be in place with a focus on mitigating the spread of COVID-19.

As you review this plan, understand that the policies and procedures laid out are directed by public health agencies and may change due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. ABCUSD is committed to creating the best possible environment for learning while maintaining a high level of safety and also addressing the social-emotional well-being of our students.

Screening at Home:

- Families should take the temperatures of student(s) daily before leaving for school. Anyone with a fever of 100.4 degrees or higher should NOT go to a school site. Absences due to personal illness, quarantine, and COVID-19 illness or symptoms will be excused and should be reported immediately to the school office.
- Students and adults should self-screen for respiratory symptoms such as cough and shortness of breath before coming to school each day. Students and adults experiencing these types of symptoms should not attend school.
- Staff members are required to self-screen and complete a daily temperature check before coming to work. If a staff member experiences symptoms, they should stay home and contact their supervisor.

Arriving at School:

- Students and staff members are required to wear face coverings when indoors. Face coverings are optional when outdoors, but recommended.
- Parents/guardians and visitors will have limited access to the school campus. See Visitors Section below.
- School sites will have designated routes for entry and exit of the campus to limit contact with others.
- School sites will have signage posted throughout campus, reminding students and staff about the need to wear a
 face mask, physically distance, wash their hands, and do other mitigation actions.
- The District has secured additional safety equipment including mobile hand-washing stations, temperature scanners, partitions, masks, and other items.

Face Coverings:

To prevent the spread of the COVID-19 virus at schools, we will follow the Centers for Disease Control, both California and Los Angeles County Departments of Public Health, and Cal/OSHA guidelines for wearing face masks, physical distancing, and cleaning.

The most recent guidance from the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health requires masks to be worn by students and staff when indoors. The LACDPH does have some exemptions. Face coverings are recommended when students and staff are outdoors, but not required. Schools will have face coverings on hand to give to students if they forget or lose theirs.

As a reminder, select a face covering for students that include the following:

- Is designed for children to ensure a proper fit.
- Fits snugly over the nose and mouth and under the chin. There should be no gaps around the edges of the face covering.
- Provides two or more layers of washable, breathable fabric.
- Disposable face coverings are not to be used multiple times.
- Accommodations may be made for students on Individualized Education or 504 Plans and those who have medical reasons for not wearing or tolerate wearing a mask.
- Please contact your school if your student is having issues with wearing a mask.

California Department of Public Health guidelines do not require physical distance but recommends a three-foot distance between students and six feet between students and adults. ABCUSD classrooms will be arranged for maximum physical distancing with students facing the same direction.

Student Transportation:

- Students must wear a face covering when riding on the bus.
- Families should conduct a health screening each morning before their student(s) leave to board the bus.
- Students will have assigned seats on the bus, helping the District with contact tracing should a student or staff member be exposed to an individual with COVID-19.
- Should a student show symptoms during the trip to or from school, the bus driver will proceed to their destination and inform the school and/or family.
- Students becoming ill or showing symptoms during the school day will not be able to board the bus after school.
- High-touch areas of the bus will be cleaned after each use, and each bus will be cleaned daily.
- Bus windows will be opened weather permitting to increase ventilation.



PREVENTING THE SPREAD AT SCHOOLS

Cleaning and Disinfecting Schools:

Schools will follow the Centers for Disease Control, as well as both California and Los Angeles County Departments of Public Health cleaning and disinfecting protocols. Playground equipment and common touch surfaces, like countertops and door handles, will be cleaned daily. Restrooms and classrooms will be cleaned frequently. Classrooms and common areas will be disinfected within 24 hours when there has been an exposure from someone with COVID-19. Staff will have approved cleaning and disinfecting products to use as needed.

Sports and Extracurricular Activities:

ABCUSD students will return to athletic competition and performing arts performances. The District will continue to follow guidance from public health and statewide sports regulation agencies in determining safety procedures. Masks must be worn when attending indoor events.

Nutrition Safety:

All students will have access to meals at no cost for the 2021-2022 school year. Students may bring their lunch from home if they would like. Each school will have posted meal service procedures for students to follow. Meal service will look similar to past school years, but with the following safety protocols:

- Meals will be eaten outside
- Students will be physically distanced
- Students will wear their masks until seated
- Frequently touched areas will be cleaned
- Areas that come in contact with food will be cleaned and sanitized before and after meals

Nutrition Services staff will continue to observe public health protocols when preparing meals for students. These protocols include wearing appropriate personal protective equipment, physical distancing, and practicing appropriate personal hygiene.

Notification of Confirmed Case:

Should a positive case of COVID-19 case occur at a school site, the following protocols will be followed:

- School administrators will notify Patty Dupont-Tyler, Head of Program for Health Services, who is the District's liaison with the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health, staff, and families immediately while maintaining confidentiality in accordance with all laws and regulations.
- Those who had close contact with the person diagnosed with COVID-19 will be asked to follow LACDPH guidance, including quarantine and self-monitoring.
- Students, families, and staff who may have been exposed will be notified.

Notifications will come from the District, in consultation with LACDPH and the District's head of program for health services. Notifications will include the following:

- Date of potential exposure (if known)
- Information on the COVID-19 incubation period and safety protocols to limit exposure.
- Contact information to local testing sites.
- Students will also receive information about returning to school.

Positive Case of COVID-19 at School:

It's possible that even with mitigation measures in place, that there will be positive cases of COVID-19 at schools. ABCUSD will work closely with LACDPH to determine if a class needs to be quarantined or a school needs to be closed due to an outbreak.

If a student shows symptoms of COVID-19 while at school, they will be immediately isolated and the school will contact the parents for immediate pickup. The student should be tested for COVID-19 and the family should report the results of the test to the school. In accordance with privacy regulations, the identity of a student who tests positive for COVID-19 is confidential.

Here is the guidance for quarantining and isolating when there is a positive case at school:


- Close contact A person who was indoors and within six feet of the infected person for more than 15 minutes over a 24-hour period.
- Students and staff members identified as close contacts should test for COVID-19, even if asymptomatic, and inform the school of the results.
- Exposed students and staff members must quarantine and monitor for symptoms for 10 days from their last contact with the infected individual if they have not received a test for COVID-19. However, they must adhere to COVID-19 preventative measures such as mask wearing, frequent hand washing or use of hand sanitizer, and physical distancing through Day 14.
- Exposed students and staff members who are tested after Day 5 from the date of exposure and the results of the test are negative, quarantine may end on Day 7. However, they must adhere to COVID-19 preventative measures through Day 14.
- Exposed students and staff members who are fully vaccinated should monitor for COVID-19 symptoms for 14 days but are not required to quarantine.
- LACDPH may contact exposed students and staff members to collect additional information.

Improving Our Schools

Work funded through Measure BB is well underway at schools across the ABC Unified School District. Using the STEPS – Safety/Security, Technology, Evolution, Parity, and Sustainability – the guiding principles proposed in the Facilities Master Plan, schools are becoming safer and receiving enhancements to meet students' needs now and into the future.

Elementary Schools

Security cameras have been installed at all elementary schools, providing an extra level of safety and security. Now, all District schools have security cameras. Elementary schools have new playground equipment and surfaces with soft surfaces and colorful new playgrounds. Elementary students can now refill their water bottles at filling stations. All District schools now have water bottle filling stations.

High Schools

Construction began at Artesia and Whitney high schools this past spring. New STEM classrooms and other areas are under construction at both schools. The District replaced Artesia High School's athletic field with a new artificial turf field. Both schools should have work completed by the end of the year. Cerritos and Gahr high schools are up next, with enhancements beginning in spring 2022.

COVID-19 Safety

With the safety of students and staff in mind, Measure BB funds assisted in providing extra handwashing and sanitizing stations at schools. These stations were critical in allowing the District to bring students back last spring.

Mejorando Nuestras Escuelas

El trabajo financiado a través de la Medida BB está muy avanzado en las escuelas de todo el Distrito Escolar Unificado ABC. Usando STEPS - Seguridad / Protección, Tecnología, Evolución, Paridad y Sostenibilidad - los principios rectores propuestos en el Plan Maestro de Instalaciones, las escuelas se están volviendo más seguras y reciben mejoras para satisfacer las necesidades de los estudiantes ahora y en el futuro.

Escuelas Primarias

Se han instalado cámaras de seguridad en todas las escuelas primarias, lo que proporciona un nivel adicional de seguridad y protección. Ahora, todas las escuelas del distrito tienen cámaras de seguridad. Las escuelas primarias tienen nuevos equipos y superficies de juegos con superficies blandas y nuevos y coloridos patios de juegos. Los estudiantes de primaria ahora pueden rellenar sus botellas de agua en las estaciones de servicio. Todas las escuelas del distrito ahora tienen estaciones de llenado de botellas de agua.

High Schools

La construcción comenzó en las escuelas preparatorias Artesia y Whitney la primavera pasada. Se están construyendo nuevas aulas STEM y otras áreas en ambas escuelas. El Distrito reemplazó el campo atlético de Artesia High School con un nuevo campo de césped artificial. Ambas escuelas deberían haber terminado el trabajo antes de fin de año. Las escuelas secundarias Cerritos y Gahr son las siguientes, con mejoras a partir de la primavera de 2022.

Seguridad COVID-19

Con la seguridad de los estudiantes y el personal en mente, los fondos de la Medida BB ayudaron a proporcionar estaciones adicionales de lavado y desinfección de manos en las escuelas. Estas estaciones fueron fundamentales para permitir que el distrito trajera a los estudiantes la primavera pasada.




