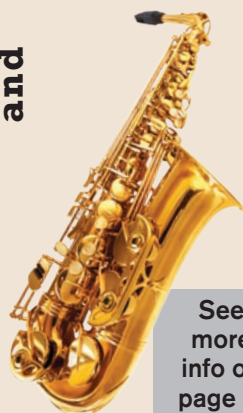

USDA Free Food Program

The City of Lawndale Free Food Program is open to all adults who qualify. The food is provided by the Food Bank of Southern California and the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA). The food bank obtains and distributes donations of nutritious food that the City of Lawndale picks up from the warehouse and packs and distributes weekly. The food received each week varies and oftentimes consists of canned goods and some type of fresh produce.

Food Distribution Information: Food distribution takes place at the Harold E. Hofmann Community Center located at 14700 Burin Avenue at the third floor Main Event Room. Food is distributed every Wednesday at 10:00 a.m. on a first come, first served basis to those who qualify until all food is gone. Lines to obtain food form early, however, no earlier than 7:00 a.m. Those obtaining food must provide signature confirming that Emergency Food Assistance Program (EFAP) guidelines are met. The Lawndale Beat Fixed-Route Transit offers effective transportation solutions within the City of Lawndale at a reasonable cost, and in many cases free of charge.



The Lawndale Beat is a seven day per week service consisting of two routes, the Residential and the Express. The Beat will get you nearly anywhere you want to go in Lawndale and links to neighboring transportation systems, such as: Metro, Torrance Transit and Beach Cities (Redondo) Transit at the Metro Green Line Station and the South Bay Galleria. The Lawndale Beat operates Monday thru Friday, 7:00 a.m. to 6:35 p.m.; Saturdays, 8:40 a.m. to 5:55 p.m.; and Sundays, 9:20 a.m. to 5:45 p.m. Fares are an incredible \$0.75! Seniors 62 years of age and older, disabled, children 6 years and younger (with a paying adult) may ride free of charge. One free transfer per passenger is available for connection to one of the neighboring transportation systems.

Summer Capital Improvements Program Update

The Public Works Department is pleased to provide you with this quarterly update of the City's Capital Improvement Program (CIP). The program covers street, concrete, and traffic improvements (including sidewalk, curb and gutter), parks, and city facilities improvements. Projects are currently under construction, in the planning and design phase, or completed.

CURRENT PROJECTS

Inglewood Avenue Widening Project:

Phase I and II of the project boundary will be from Manhattan Beach Boulevard to the I-405 Freeway northbound on-ramp, as well as the Marine Avenue intersection. The project will include construction of a right turn pocket, pavement resurfacing, crosswalk and traffic signal replacements, utility relocation, curb, gutter, traffic striping and other roadway modifications that will complete the traffic improvements throughout the project limits.

Phase III of the project will widen Inglewood Avenue to provide a third southbound traffic lane from south of 147th Street to Marine Avenue. The project will also provide a continuous 10' wide sidewalk from Lawndale High School to Marine Avenue, a raised landscaped median island, traffic synchronization, street striping, and other roadway modifications that will complete the traffic improvements throughout the project limits.

The project is in the design phase and is anticipated to be completed in 2018. Funding sources include Measure R, Proposition C and other federal funds (SAFETEA-LU).



COMPLETED PROJECTS

Larch Avenue Street Improvements Project:

The recently completed project included street improvements on Larch Avenue from W. 147th Street to Marine Avenue. In addition to other improvements, the project addressed street infrastructure deficiencies such as poor pavement conditions, drainage issues resulting from damaged gutters, outdated wheelchair ramps, damaged driveway approaches and sidewalks. The project was funded by Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and Measure R funds.

Storm Drain Replacement Project:

The project's scope of work addressed the broken storm drain pipe and sink holes at the intersection of 169th Street and 170th Street. The existing 18" corrugated metal pipe will be replaced with one hundred and fifty (150) linear feet of reinforced concrete pipe. Construction elements included demolition, removal, potholing, trenching, traffic control, pipe installation, trench backfill, and paving repair.

Street Improvement Projects:

The City's Capital Improvement Program has identified the following streets for improvements:

- 162nd Street from Firmona Avenue to Hawthorne Blvd.
- 164th Street from Inglewood Avenue to Freeman Avenue
- 168th Street from Inglewood Avenue to Prairie Avenue
- 170th Street from Inglewood Avenue to Hawthorne Blvd.
- Larch Ave. from Marine Ave. to Manhattan Beach Blvd.
- Prairie Avenue from north City limit to south of 149th St.
- Osage Avenue from Firmona Avenue to 167th Street
- Alley west of Hawthorne Blvd. from 166th St. to 167th St.
- Alley east of Hawthorne Blvd. from 166th St. to 169th St.

The various street improvements will address asphalt pavement repairs, restored roadway gutter/drainage flows, necessary modifications to eliminate/diminish street and cross-gutter nuisance water, and removal, where appropriate, of existing slotted cross-gutters. In addition, the project repaired damaged sidewalks, curbs and gutters, cross-gutters, alley gutters, curb return ramps, driveway approaches and re-establishment of traffic striping and markings as well as pavement markers and signage.

The project began in January 2017 and is anticipated to be completed in the fall of 2017. Funding sources included Measure R, State Gas Tax Revenues, Proposition C, TDA, and STP-L.

SHARPS Collection Program

The City's waste hauler, Republic Services, is now offering residents of Lawndale, at no additional charge, the collection of used SHARPS. Within one week of request, a pre-paid, postage-paid mail-back container to safely collect used SHARPS and to send used SHARPS for proper disposal will be delivered to each resident making a request. Each container shall be of adequate volume to accommodate the needs of a diabetic person for a three month period. What Are the Effects of Illegal Dumping?

Dismantled televisions are finding their way into the fair streets of our city. Illegally dumped and stripped down TVs pose a serious threat to families and their children.

Not only do TVs contain broken glass, choking hazards, and sharp wires, they contain many hazardous chemicals that can cause serious injury and illness if directly exposed to or inhaled.

Some of these chemicals and their potential effects on our bodies are listed below:



- **Lead:** Exposure to lead can cause muscle weakness, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, constipation, and in more extreme cases can damage your kidneys.
- **Mercury:** Exposure can cause tremors, emotional changes, insomnia, headaches, neuromuscular changes, and in higher exposures, respiratory failure, kidney effects and potentially death.
- **Cadmium:** Exposure can cause vomiting, damage to lungs and kidneys, and can potentially cause cancer.
- **Arsenic:** Exposure can cause vomiting, diarrhea, numbness and tingling in extremities, rashes, liver and kidney damage, and in more extreme cases, even death.

These are only four of the toxic chemicals that are found in old, abandoned televisions that threaten your well-being, and if not disposed of properly will leak into our environment through the soil and groundwater.

You can help to combat these threats to others by keeping these chemicals away from our families by properly disposing of old televisions by doing one of the following:

- **Call for a bulky item pickup:** The City's waste hauler, Republic Services, will collect your old television as a bulky item pickup; however, you have to contact them beforehand at (800) 299-4898 to schedule a pickup appointment.
- **Dispose of Item Yourself:** If you would like to dispose of a television yourself, you may take it to the following location: Hyperion Treatment Plant, 7660 W. Imperial Hwy, Gate B, Playa Del Rey, CA 90293
Hours: Saturdays and Sundays from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.
- **Donate it to Charity:** If you would like to donate your old television, instead of recycling it, another option is to donate it to Goodwill Industries at (800) GOODWILL or the Salvation Army at (800) 95-TRUCK.

New Law – Commercial Organics and Food Waste Recycling

In October of 2014, Governor Brown signed Assembly Bill 1826 requiring certain businesses and multi-family complexes to recycle their organic waste beginning April 1, 2016. Organics are defined as food waste, food-soiled paper, landscaping waste, and compostable utensils.

The requirement for businesses to recycle organics/food waste will be phased in starting with the largest generators such as



grocery stores, large restaurants, and food processing businesses. Also covered under this bill are multi-family complexes of 5 units or more. Multi-family complexes are not required to recycle food waste, but are required to recycle landscaping waste.

Lawndale has established an organics recycling program that will be available to Lawndale businesses and multi-family complexes that fall under AB 1826 at no additional charge. Businesses will place organics/food waste in specially designed bags and place them in the trash receptacle and Republic Services will separate the bags from the trash at their processing facility. Businesses and multi-family complexes can sign up for landscape and/or organics recycling service by contacting Republic Services at (800) 299-4898.

Organic waste accounts for about 40% of the material in landfills that Californians dispose of annually. Most organic waste is recyclable through methods such as composting, mulching, and anaerobic digestion. Recycling organic waste not only saves our valuable landfill space, but also creates green jobs.

Schedule Your Bulky Item Pickup Today!

The City of Lawndale and Republic Services are here to help you dispose of your large and bulky items responsibly. These items can include refrigerators, sofas, mattresses, computers, toilets and many other items.

City of Lawndale single-family residents are offered four "bulky item" pickups each year. Each pickup can include up to four items. Single family residents that exceed the number of pickups or place more than 4 items out per pickup, or do not schedule their pickup in advance with Republic Services, will be charged a fee of \$22.22 for each additional item collected. Residents living in multi-family complexes can receive one bulky item pickup per year per unit. Bulky items are limited to items that can be lifted by two men. Call Republic Services' customer service at least 24 hours in advance of your regular trash collection day at (800) 299-4898 to schedule your collection.

Another way to easily schedule your bulky item pickup is to download, sign up and use the My Resource™ app from Republic Services on your cell phone. You can also use the app to pay your bills, report a missed pickup and even rate their service.

Before scheduling a bulky item or electronic waste pickup, consider donating your old items to charity. To donate items, call Goodwill Industries at (800) GOODWILL or the Salvation Army at (800) 95-TRUCK for more information. The closest donation centers to Lawndale are located below:

Are You a Responsible Dog Owner? Anyone Can Be By Following a Few Simple Steps.

Below are a few reminders about some of the things you can do to be a responsible pet owner. These tips will help you, and your neighbors, have an enjoyable experience with your dog.

- All dogs are required to be licensed with the City annually.
- All dogs should be current on their rabies vaccination throughout the entire licensing period.
- It is not permissible to allow your dog to run at large at any time. Dogs should be kept on a leash whenever they are off your property.
- When taking your dog off property, you must have the proper supplies such as disposable baggies and gloves, or a scooper, so pet waste can be disposed of in a sanitary manner. It is unlawful to allow the animal waste to remain on any public or private property not owned or leased by the animal owner.
- For the peace and tranquility of your neighborhood, dog barking should be monitored and steps taken to limit the continuous or extended barking of your pet. If you and your neighbor are having difficulty coming to an agreement over pet noise, please contact the City's free mediation service to assist you. 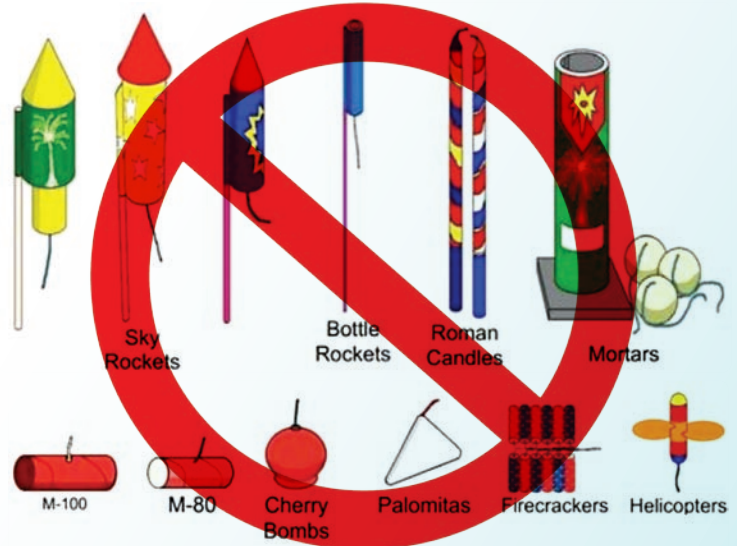
Igniting Illegal Fireworks is a Crime in Lawndale! Violators Will Be Fined \$1,000!



The City of Lawndale, the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department and the Los Angeles County Fire Department will be out in force this Fourth of July season to curb the use of illegal fireworks in Lawndale. Illegal fireworks are any fireworks that do not bear the California Fire Marshal "Safe and Sane" designation. Safe and Sane fireworks can only be used in Lawndale from noon until 11:59 p.m. on the 4th of July. Any firework that shoots up in the air or explodes is illegal anywhere and at any time in the City of Lawndale. Fireworks are also prohibited in all City parks.

Violations of these laws will be strictly enforced and are punishable by up to a \$1,000 fine plus penalties and assessments from the courts.

If you know of areas in your neighborhood where illegal fireworks are used each year, please notify the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department or the Municipal Services Department for additional information.

Did You Know...?

...that Planning Department approval is required prior to installing any concrete or paving in the front yard setback (front 20 feet) of your property? If you would like to install a new parking pad, driveway or walkway, please obtain approval first. Even if you are just replacing old concrete or paving, you may need approval, so always contact the City's Community Development Department to find out if you need a permit before you begin the work. A brief phone call, or visit to City Hall, will be much less problematic than a code enforcement violation or removal of work that has already been completed.

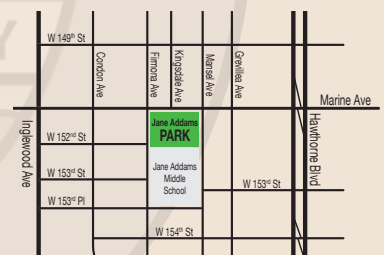

¿Cuáles son los Efectos Dañosos de Desechar Artículos Ilegalmente?

Televisores desarmados están apareciendo en las calles de nuestra ciudad. Los televisores desarmados y tirados ilegalmente presentan una amenaza seria para las familias y sus hijos.



Los televisores no solamente contienen vidrios rotos, peligro de atorarse en la garganta, y cables puntiagudos, también contienen químicos que pueden causar serias lesiones y enfermedades si se les expone directamente a ellos o si son inhalados.

Algunos de estos químicos y sus posibles efectos en nuestros cuerpos, están enlistados a continuación:

- **Plomo:** La exposición al plomo puede causar debilidad muscular, náuseas, vómito, diarrea, estreñimiento y en casos extremos puede dañar los riñones.
- **Mercurio:** Su exposición puede causar temblores, cambios emocionales, insomnio, dolores de cabeza, cambios neuromusculares y ante una exposición mayor, insuficiencia respiratoria, efectos en los riñones y puede causar la muerte.

Nueva Ley – Programa Comercial de Reciclaje de Desecho de Alimentos/Orgánicos



En octubre del 2014, el Gobernador Brown firmó el Proyecto de Ley 1826 requiriendo que ciertos negocios y complejos multi-familiares reciclen el desecho orgánico a partir del 1° de abril de 2016. Lo orgánico se define como desecho de alimentos, papel sucio de alimentos, papeles de jardinería y utensilios de abono.

Los requisitos para que los comercios reciclen desecho orgánico/alimentos comenzará con los generadores más grandes como mercados, restaurantes grandes y comercios de procesamiento de alimentos. También bajo este Proyecto de ley están los complejos multifamiliares de 5 unidades o más. Los complejos multifamiliares no requieren reciclaje de desecho de alimentos pero se requiere que se recicle el desecho de jardín.

Lawndale ha establecido el programa de reciclaje orgánico que estará disponible en los comercios de Lawndale y los complejos multifamiliares que entran dentro del Proyecto de ley AB 1826 sin costo adicional. Los comercios pondrán el desecho de alimentos orgánicos en bolsas especialmente diseñadas, en receptáculos de basura y Republic Services separará las bolsas, de la basura en sus instalaciones de procesamiento. Los comercios y los complejos multifamiliares pueden registrarse para el servicio de reciclaje orgánico y de jardín, contactando a (800) 299-4898.

Los desechos orgánicos representan alrededor del 40% de material en vertederos que los Californianos desechan anualmente. La mayoría del desecho orgánico es reciclable a través de métodos como compostaje, acolchado y digestión anaeróbica. 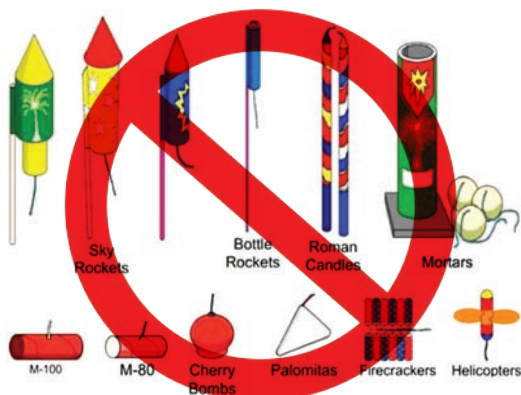

Los fuegos artificiales ilegales son los fuegos artificiales que no cuentan con la designación de "Safe and Sane" del jefe de bomberos de California. Los fuegos artificiales "Safe and Sane" son los únicos que se pueden usar en Lawndale de las 12 del medio día, hasta las 11:59 de la noche del 4 de Julio. Cualquier fuego artificial que se dispare hacia arriba en el aire y explote, es ilegal en cualquier lugar, a cualquier hora, en la Ciudad de Lawndale. Los Fuegos Artificiales también están prohibidos en los parques de la Ciudad.

La violación a estas leyes será estrictamente observada y castigable por hasta \$1,000 de multa, más recargos de los juzgados.
